Last week we had two near misses with parents having to take evasive action in order not to hit children with their cars. The crossings are at either end of the school so that students can cross the road safely, please encourage your children to cross the road at these crossings where it is safest. A reminder to all parents that the Staff car park is not a drop-off or pick up point.

Physical and verbal abuse will not be tolerated under any circumstance. This includes when you ring the school. 
'Getting to Know You Interviews' - Tuesday 20th February


