### Student Accident Insurance

The department does not provide personal accident insurance or ambulance cover for students. Parents / Carers of students, who do not have student accident insurance / ambulance cover, are responsible for paying the cost of medical treatment for injured students, including the cost of ambulance attendance or transport as well as any other transport costs. Although we never want our students to be injured at school and we take every precaution to ensure the safety of all students, accidents do happen. Whilst its not compulsory we encourage all caregivers to consider taking out insurance just in case.



### Sickness and Lateness

I understand the stress and strain child illness can place on a family. Unfortunately, children get sick and the best place for them to be is at home resting until they have fully recovered. Schools are a place for learning, and children are unable to learn when they are feeling sick. It is imperative that if your child falls ill at school and we do have to call you, that you to respond in a timely manner or arrange for someone else to collect your child from school. Illnesses can spread very quickly. If your child feels unwell early in the morning before school, and then begins to feel better, you are welcome to bring them to school after 9am to ensure they can still access their learning.

## Grade 4 Writing M12



This term Grade 4 students in M12 have been exploring the genre of procedure writing. We have had the opportunity to investigate the language features and structure of procedural texts. We have also had some interactive experiences to practise how we give instructions and write procedures for people to follow. This started out as how to butter a slice of bread and last week we undertook the challenge of writing a procedure for how to make the best salad sandwich.

We first had to draft our procedure for making a salad sandwich by using our knowledge from the previous week. Especially how important it was to write specific and detailed instructions.

We then had to fill in our template using dot points as we prepared our delicious salad sandwich. We wrote instructions like...



- spread mayonnaise on one slice of bread.

- choose two pieces of bread and place them carefully on your plate.



grate the carrot slowly onto a plate.

After we assembled our salad sandwich and finished our procedure, we were able to taste our hard work.



Over the next few days, we worked on refining our original template by writing more detailed sentences using specific verbs (slice, chop, spread, assemble) and adverbs (slowly, carefully) and transitional words (first, next, then). Last we had to draw pictures to match the steps we wrote about.



It was a delicious and fun way to learn about writing procedure texts!

# SCHOOL WIDE POSITIVE BEHAVIOUR SUPPORT

School Wide Positive Behaviour Support (SWPBS) is a framework which we use across the whole school to model, acknowledge and reward positive behaviour. Everyone in the school community is aware of our behaviour expectations, as listed in our Behaviour Matrix, and using the SWPBS framework is an effective way of reducing negative and unwanted behaviour. By focussing on good behaviour choices, students are encouraged to gain attention by doing the correct thing, rather than getting attention for doing the wrong thing.

Students are given clear details of what positive behaviour looks like and there are posters and banners throughout the school as reminders of our school values and how to display them. Students choose a reward chart and gain stickers for positive behaviour and displaying school values, then when their chart is full of stickers, they can select a reward of their choice.


