### **Attendance**



Attendance at school is compulsory unless your child is sick or attending a medical appointment. Please ensure that your child attends school and is on time. The school day begins at 8:45am with learning beginning at 9am. Please help us to support your child get the best possible education they can by coming to school and being on time each and every day.



### **Sickness**

I understand the stress and strain child illness can place on a family. Unfortunately, children get sick and the best place for them to be is at home resting until they have fully recovered. Schools are a place for learning, and children are unable to learn when they are feeling sick. It is imperative that if your child falls ill at school and we do have to call you, that you respond in a timely manner or arrange for someone else to collect your child from school. Illnesses can spread very quickly. If your child feels unwell early in the morning before school, and then begins to feel better, you are welcome to bring them to school after 9am to ensure they can still access their learning.



### Out of school hours care



# SCHOOL WIDE POSITIVE BEHAVIOUR SUPPORT (SWPBS)

School Wide Positive Behaviour Support (SWPBS) is a framework which we use across the whole school to model, acknowledge and reward positive behaviour. Everyone in the school community is aware of our behaviour expectations, as listed in our Behaviour Matrix, and using the SWPBS framework is an effective way of reducing negative and unwanted behaviour. By focussing on good behaviour choices, students are encouraged to gain attention by doing the correct thing, rather than getting attention for doing the wrong thing.

Students are given clear details of what positive behaviour looks like and there are posters and banners throughout the school as reminders of our school values and how to display them. Students choose a reward chart and gain stickers for positive behaviour and displaying school values, then when their chart is full of stickers, they can select a reward of their choice.



# SWPBS in action...



This week, Jackson in P8 asked a very clever question of his teacher Katie when they were chatting about our School Wide Positive Behaviour awards. He asked; 'Why don't we have a blue chart?'. You see, we have a green chart which matches our Responsible Value, an orange chart to match our Determined Value and a yellow one to match our Resilient Value. Where is the blue chart?

It is so amazing to hear even our brand new Prep students talking about and thinking about our school values.

# **Breakfast Club**

It's important for your child to eat something nutritious each morning to re-fuel for the busy day ahead. Eating breakfast improves alertness, concentration, mood and memory. Skipping breakfast may affect your child's concentration or leave them feeling 'fuzzy'.



If your child doesn't eat breakfast at home, they can visit the artroom from 8.45am each morning for 'take-away' breakfast of toast, fresh fruit, a fruitcup or milk.

Coral Park Primary is a SunSmart school and is committed to ensuring our students and staff are protected from the harsh effects of the sun during the warmer months of September to May. **School hats need to be worn for all outside activities** to ensure protection from UV rays and water bottles need to be used to make sure students remain hydrated and ready to learn.



## The Drop off Pick up zone

The Drop off Pick up zone is a special place to quickly drop off or pick up your child when you use your car.

Some schools have internal school drop off areas located within the grounds, whereas others are located outside the school grounds. It is important to follow the rules in these zones, whether it is an internal or external drop off pick up zone.

In the external drop off pick up zone the following rules apply:

You can only stay in this zone for 2 minutes each time and you must stay with your car.

Move as far down the drop off pick up zone as possible to allow more cars to enter the zone safely.

Arrive at least 3 minutes after the school bell - children are not ready or in this zone before this time.

Do not arrive in this zone early and park - this stops this zone flowing and fines can apply.

Child not there? Keep moving!









### National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) 2023

The National Assessment Program – Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) tests will be conducted from 15<sup>th</sup> - 27<sup>th</sup> March 2023. From this year on, the NAPLAN tests will be conducted in Term 1 rather than in Term 2. Coral Park Primary School will be completing these tests online and the testing period will run over two weeks. These tests are common national tests undertaken by all students in Years 3, 5, 7 and 9. The Victorian Curriculum and Assessment Authority (VCAA) is responsible for NAPLAN across the state.

NAPLAN provides information to students, teachers, parent/carers and school communities about how students are performing against the national benchmarks for literacy and numeracy. The results provide a measure of how Australian schools and students are performing in the areas of reading, writing, spelling, language conventions and numeracy.

Specifically, information gained is used for:

- individual student reports to parents
- school reporting to their communities, and
- aggregate reporting against national standards.

It is also important to recognise that the National Assessment Program is not seen as the sole criterion for measuring student performance, but rather as a part of a broad range of measures used by teachers to evaluate and assess the learning and teaching process.

To assist in the administration of NAPLAN, parents/carers are asked to keep the 15<sup>th</sup> – 27<sup>th</sup> March free from interruptions to the normal school routine. Parents/carers could also assist their children by speaking positively about the tests with the view to avoid undue student anxiety.

Teachers will ensure students are familiar with the test formats and will provide appropriate support and guidance leading up to the test date. Over the next few weeks our Year 3 and 5 students will be given the opportunity to participate in NAPLAN practice testing. The purpose of these tests is to provide an opportunity for our students to familiarise themselves with the test layout, types of questions and test conditions.


