IMPORTANT NAPLAN INFORMATION FOR YEAR 3 & YEAR 5 STUDENTS

A reminder that from next Wednesday 13th March, our Year 3 and Year 5 students will be undertaking NAPLAN testing. It is important that students are here for these sessions. Over the last few weeks all students have been participating in classroom activities and practice tests to prepare them for these assessments so that they feel comfortable and supported when the real tests are taking place.

To best prepare your child for NAPLAN testing we recommend the following:

- 1. **Getting a good night's sleep** helps short and long-term memory performance, the ability to focus, decision-making capacity, maths processing and cognitive speed all things that could make a big difference when completing a test.
- 2. **Sticking to your normal morning routine** is very important as it will help normalise the day for students (particularly if they are feeling anxious or stressed.)
- 3. Research shows that pupils and students who eat breakfast perform better in tests. A full stomach helps students to concentrate. Breakfast club will be running every day during the NAPLAN testing period.

If you have any concerns about your child participating in NAPLAN testing, please contact your child's teacher, or the Assistant Principal Liz Wilson, via the office.

If your child is unwell on the day of any of their scheduled tests, they will be able to do a catch-up test once they return to school. The final date for the Year 3 writing catch-up test is Monday 18th March, and the final date for all other catch-up tests is Monday 25th March.



As a family, **go on a walk outside in nature**. This might be around your local walking track, at your local park or just around your streets.


