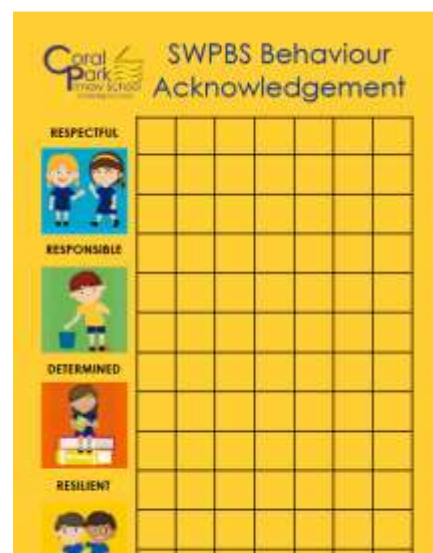

School Wide Positive Behaviour Support (SWPBS)

It has been that time of year already when our staff have participated in our Annual SWPBS Self Assessment Survey (SAS). This online, anonymous survey asks all our staff to answer a series of questions regarding several aspects of our SWPBS practices at school. We do the survey as a 'pulse-check' on how well we are implementing each of the important SWPBS elements. Staff must choose an answer from 'In Place, Partially in Place or Not in Place'. This year we achieved very high percentages in the areas of:

- Our behaviour support team responds promptly to students with chronic behaviours of concern.
- Our consequences for problem behaviours are defined clearly.
- Expected student behaviours are taught directly.

This data also helps us to find areas of future improvement. In 2024, we will pay particular attention to the Element; *'Data on problem behaviour patterns are collected and summarised within an ongoing system'*. This will help us to get better at analysing behaviour data and putting explicit teaching and learning activities in place.

A very big thank you to all of our parents who completed our SWPBS Parent Survey. The results from this survey were very positive, we will share these with our community very soon.

Don't forget, check in regularly with your child about their SWPBS token chart. Ask about which colour they are working on achieving and what reward they are working towards. Maybe they will be able to tell you about a sticker they have been awarded recently too.

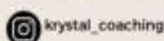
