Coral Park school hats are available from the office for \$10.




Students were excited to be awarded with books and certificates at assembly last term in recognition of 100 and 200 Nights of Reading.



Through a series of exciting challenges, Zanna and Eddie experience the power of empathy, respect, kindness and resilience. When they launch the app, they discover that children all over the world can use it to be assertive, responsible and safe online.

Coral Park Primary School has received an email from Highway Patrol Police regarding school children using E Scooters. They have been receiving complaints from the public.

We remind parents and carers that e-scooters are **only legal for people over 16 years and over**.

Riders of e-scooters must:

- wear a helmet
- be aged 16 or over
- ride at a maximum speed of 20 km/h hour
- ride on shared-use paths, bicycle paths, or roads with a speed limit of up to 60 km/h have flashing or steady front and rear lights if riding at night or in low-light

Riders must not:

- ride on the footpath
- use a mobile phone while riding
- ride while under the influence of drugs or alcohol
- carry passengers or animals or ride in tandem
- ride a high-speed e-scooter capable of more than 25km/h
 (this is considered an unregistered vehicle and penalties apply)
- ride on roads with a speed limit over 60 km/h
