Students in J7 enjoyed dressing in their traditional costume and sharing cultural food to celebrate Harmony Day.




























2024 Casey Student Leaders Reception



CLASS TIME 9AM - 3:15PM Locked away in the teacher's office.


AFTER SCHOOL 3:15 - 3:30PM


